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

It was agreed that such exposure would be highly beneficial for the students and would enhance their readiness for the industry.
- As per the responses from student feedbacks, there is a growing need for a placement drive to facilitate job opportunities for our graduating students. A well-organized placement drive will provide a platform for students to showcase their skills to potential employers.
- Enhancing seminars and webinars entails several steps. First, content should be well-researched, engaging, and relevant. Interactive elements like Q&A sessions can be added. Technical issues must be minimized, with user-friendly interfaces. Promotion and accessibility for a broader audience should also be prioritized, making them informative and inclusive learning experiences.
- > The initiative to increase MOUs with industry partners and other institutions was discussed to foster collaboration, exchange programs, and research opportunities.
- > The next IQAC meeting will be scheduled July 2021 to review the progress of these action items, discuss any challenges, and address additional matters related to quality enhancement, compliance, and student welfare.
